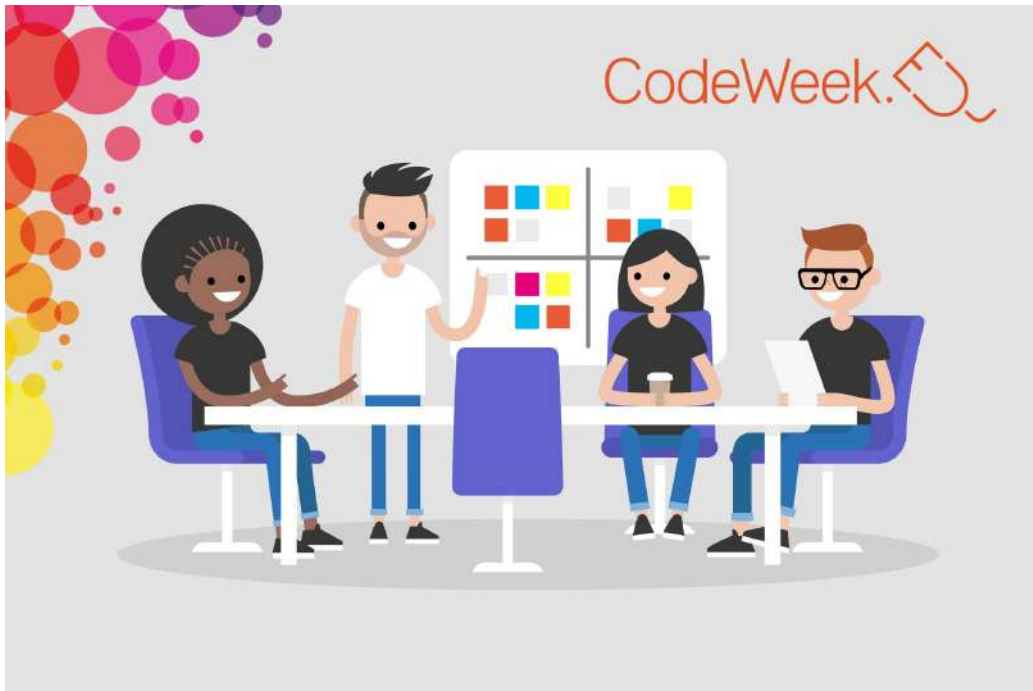

## **Croatia joins efforts to encourage women participation in the digital and technology sectors**
